The Robert Tatin Open Air Museum is in Cossé-le-Vivien (Mayenne). Robert Tatin was born in Laval in 1902 and died in 1983. He devoted the last 21 years of his life to creating a museum that falls into the category of modern naive art. He bought an old house in Cossé-le-Vivien in 1962 and started his arcane collection of sculptures, bas-reliefs and buildings all set in beautiful gardens. Cossé-le-Vivien is roughly 73 kms from Châteaubriant.

CAMPING/CARAVANNING/MOTORCARAVANNING

An overview of road toll provisions in the major European travel destinations:

Slovenia: Car/caravan combinations and motorhomes under 3.5 tons need a vignette (toll sticker). Lightweight motorhomes under 3.5 tons are classified under the private car category depending on their height, i.e. in vignette category 2A. In the case of car/caravan combinations, the vignette category depends on the height of the towing vehicle: car/caravan combinations with a towing vehicle under 1.3 metres in height at the front axle are also classified under category 2A. If the height of the towing vehicle is over 1.3 metres, the road toll will be higher, i.e. in accordance with category 2B. However, there is no separate toll for the unit being towed. Heavy motorhomes over 3.5 tons have to pay a toll depending on the distance. This used to be possible by paying cash or via credit card at the toll booth but, as of April 2018, payment can now only be made via a transponder by the name of “DarsGo unit”.

Italy & Croatia: A distance-related toll is payable on motorways. The amount in Croatia is determined for both car/caravan combinations and motorhomes by the maximum permissible weight and the number of axles. In Italy, the toll is calculated according to the latter (regardless of the total weight). The charge has to be paid at the toll booths when leaving the motorway. Numerous Italian city centres have limited traffic zones, known as “Zona Traffico limitato” (ZTL), which can only be entered with a special permit.

Germany: In Germany, there are no toll charges on the motorways. A special feature are the so-called environmental zones, which now exist in more than 50 German cities. The only vehicles allowed in these environmental zones are those displaying an environmental sticker indicating that they do not exceed a particular exhaust emission limit. The criterion for entry into most zones is the “green” environmental sticker. This means, for example, that diesel vehicles have to comply with Euroclass 4 at least.

Austria: On motorways/freeways, the vignette (toll sticker) is compulsory for vehicles (including motorhomes) up to and including a maximum permissible weight of 3.5 tons. Units towed by these vehicles are not subject to the vignette. Vehicles over 3.5 tons come under the distance-related toll charge regulations (“GO-Box” truck toll system). A digital vignette can be purchased as an alternative to the toll sticker.

Switzerland: Car/caravan combinations up to 3.5 tons require a vignette on Swiss motorways. In the case of car/caravan combinations, a separate vignette is need for the unit being towed. It is more difficult for heavy motorhomes and car/caravan combinations over 3.5 tons because they have to pay a flat-rate heavy vehicle charge on all roads.

Hungary: All vehicles require an e-vignette. The vehicle registration number is recorded before driving onto the motorway, so there is no vignette to stick on the windscreen. Car/caravan combinations up to 3.5 tons are classified under category D1 as passenger cars. If the towing vehicle has more than seven seats, however, a category U vignette then also has to be purchased



for the unit being towed. Motorhomes need a category D2 e-vignette regardless of their gross weight.

Serbia, Macedonia & Greece: A distance-related toll charge has to be paid at the toll booths for using the motorways in all three countries. For car/caravan combinations, the amount of the charge is calculated according to the overall height. For motorhomes, the cost is determined according to the maximum permissible weight in Serbia, according to the number of axles in Macedonia and according to the overall height of the vehicle in Greece.

Czech Republic: Car/caravan combinations and lightweight motorhomes under 3.5 tons require a vignette. There is no additional charge for the unit being towed. A distance-related toll is charged for motorhomes over 3.5 tons via an electronic transmitter. Additional routes travelled by these are also subject to a toll charge.

Slovakia: In Slovakia, the e-vignette is applied by recording the vehicle registration number. If the gross weight of the car/caravan combination is under 3.5 tons, a vignette is only needed for the towing vehicle. As soon as the combination of the towing vehicle and the unit being towed exceeds 3.5 tons, the unit being towed then needs its own vignette in addition. Motorhomes always require a vignette, regardless of the gross weight.

Spain: In Spain, a distance-related charge has to be paid on the privately operated motorways "autopistas". The amount depends on the number of axles. In contrast, the state-run "autovias" are toll-free.

France: A distance-related toll charge is payable on all motorways. For both car/caravan combinations and motorhomes, the toll charge is higher from an overall height of more than 3 metres. Environmental zones have been set up in several French cities and only vehicles that display a sticker indicating that a certain exhaust emission limit is not exceeded may enter these zones.

Norway: Numerous motorway routes, tunnels and bridges are subject to toll charges, though the charges are not higher for either car/caravan combinations or motorhomes than for passenger cars. Payment is fully electronic, with the vehicle registration number recorded at the toll booths and a bill for the charges to be paid sent by mail. Cash payment is not possible. Motorhomes over 3.5 tons require a mandatory "AutoPASS Chip" to pay the charges.

Sweden: A City Toll has to be paid when driving into the cities of Göteborg and Stockholm. There is no charge for the use of motorways. Those wanting to use the Öresund Bridge from Denmark to Sweden for their journey to Scandinavia should not underestimate the charges: a one-way trip costs €100 for motorhomes and car/caravan combinations.

A fire in a caravan or motorcaravan generally ends in disaster sooner rather than later. In just a few minutes a caravan can become engulfed in flames and there is no chance of saving anything - except oneself.

A very detailed article on such fires was published in Kampeerauto (NKC-NL) along with tips on how one can reduce fire risks in the first place.



- Have your gas installation serviced every two years
- Clean the burner on your fridge every two years
- Replace gas tubing and pressure reducers in your gas tank regularly
- Have a qualified electrician carry out work on your electrical installation
- Do not use a crown stone heating arrangement or electric terminal connectors
- Do not leave cables coiled up under your caravan/motorcaravan
- Have a foam fire extinguisher to hand and change it every 10 years
- Buy a fire blanket
- Install a smoke alarm with a long life battery in your caravan/motorcaravan

Camping in Denmark

The Camping Key Europe camping card is no longer necessary if you want to camp in Denmark: the requirement to buy the Danish camping card was abolished in 2017.

Denmark does not allow wild camping – you have to camp on an official campsite. But there are lots of natural camping locations for people who want to camp in the midst of nature. Official campsites are often just a stone's throw apart.

Health

Juniper oil for back pain

Juniper oil (available from pharmacies) can alleviate back pain such as sciatica or lumbago. You simply massage the painful spot gently with the oil. It is also recommended for arthritis.

Is sleep more restorative before midnight?

This year Cologne is celebrating the **200th anniversary** of the birth of one of the city's famous sons, **the composer Jacques (Jacob) Offenbach**, with a grand festival of music. The highlight is a two-week programme of concerts and performances on Cologne's Offenbach-Platz and in surrounding chateaux and parks from 9 to 26 June. Jacques Offenbach is reckoned to be the founder of operetta and lived in Paris for most of his life.

Proof that plastic has turned up inside humans

Practical tips – for campers too

Avoid mildew spots on your shower curtain

Put the curtain in the clothes washer every few weeks. Then leave overnight in a clean bucket of salty water (2 tablespoons of salt to 10 litres of water) and hang up to dry. The salt prevents a build-up of mildew.

Revive herbs in sugared water

Fresh herbs wilt very quickly. But if you cut the bottom of the stems and put the herbs in a glass of sugared water, you will find that they revive very quickly.

Australia: Since the introduction of a ruling making the wearing of helmets mandatory for cyclists in Australia, the number of fatal accidents has fallen by 50%. Moreover, the number of cyclists on the road in Sydney has risen since the ruling was introduced that is designed to protect against severe head injuries.
