Mobile homes may be rented on the Capitol Camping site in Ostea, the venue chosen for the 2020 F.I.C.C. Rally – <u>www.campingcapitol.com</u>

There are two categories: "Mobile economy house" "Baya Blu" (for 4 people), costing €700 for the duration of the rally (incl. 1 x bed linen and hand towel) and "Baia Sardinia" (for 6 people}, costing €900 (including 1 x bedlinen and hand towel).

There will be an extra charge of €36 per dog or cat staying in a mobile home.

The so-called "tourist tax" is charged extra on arrival at the campsite. The amount is fixed by the city authorities and is as yet unknown for 2020.

91st INTERNATIONAL F.I.C.C. RALLY at Naas Racecourse near Dublin/Ireland from 29 July to 7 August 2021



On 7th May 2019, a site visit was carried out by the Rally Commission to the proposed venue for the 91st F.I.C.C. International Rally, Naas, Ireland.

Naas Racecourse is 900 metres from the centre of Naas and only 32km from the centre of Dublin. The main point of entry to Ireland will be via Dublin port or airport, although new ferry routes, favourable to those coming from France, Spain and Portugal may be introduced, following Brexit.

The Organisers will have the full use of Naas Racecourse for the duration of the rally. Full catering and bar facilities are available, while internet is available to all within all the buildings in the racecourse.

It is intended that camping areas will be inside the Racetrack, with water being piped to these areas. A hard road leads to the entrances to the camping areas.



Showers and sanitary blocks will be provided to augment those in the permanent buildings, as per F.I.C.C.'s guidelines. Tanks will be provided for black effluent and grey water along the hedgerows. 150KVa generators (Silent Run) will provide 6 amps power to those booking it, but people not booking it will find themselves in a separate area from those who do. People with medical needs will have access to a greater supply of electricity and they will be accommodated closer to the buildings.

Total site capacity with 10m x 10m pitches is in excess of 1000 units.

A large marquee will be erected beside the restaurant which will be used for evening entertainment from 8.00pm to 10.30pm. From 10.30pm entertainment will be in the grandstand bar (adults only). There are medical facilities on site and police, fire and ambulance services in the town.

There are 2 hotels close by the site. The nearest is about 400 metres away and the second hotel (Lawlors Hotel) is in the main square of Naas which is 900 metres from the site entrance. This hotel is to be upgraded with an additional 70 plus bedrooms. Work will be completed and the hotel reopened by Easter 2021. Work on upgrading the hotel will begin middle of this year and must be completed and the hotel fully open by Easter 2021.

A wide selection of tours will be arranged direct from the rally site and frequent bus services are available from Naas direct to the centre of Dublin. Norman Taylor

Caravanning statistics for Europe

The European caravanning industry had an extraordinarily successful year in 2018.

There were exactly 202,611 new registrations of recreational vehicles in Europe in 2018, up 6.7% on the previous year. The 200,000 threshold was exceeded for the first time since 2007 although there were many more caravans in those days.

Germany was the European frontrunner once again last year, with 71,186 new registrations of motorcaravans and caravans and the market once more recorded strong growth of 12.5%. With 35,743 new registrations of leisure vehicles, Great Britain remained the second biggest national market in Europe although the figure did represent a drop of 6.2%.

France, the third largest European market, recorded 32,002 vehicles, an increase of 8.6%.

As a result of these encouraging results, the industry is forecasting increasing exports again in 2019. Despite Great Britain, the second biggest European caravan market, leaving the EU, none of the exporting companies are expecting their business to suffer.

Biggest Lego caravan

The biggest Lego caravan is made up of 288,630 separate pieces. Up to now the record was held by Lego-T@b using 215,000 pieces. This latest caravan comprising all these brightly coloured bricks is a life-size replica of a 1973 Australian Viscount Royal caravan and is complete with a stove, fridge, washbasin, chessboard, drawers with cutlery and even a tub of Vegemite all made out of Lego tiles. Ben Graig, who built the caravan, inadvertently managed to lock himself in his workshop on one occasion and had to spend the night on the Lego bed. His caravan had its première last year at the Queensland Caravan Camping and Touring Supershow.

Germany: Caravan sector in numbers

° There were 71,000 new registrations of caravans and motorcaravans recorded in 2018, the highest number ever

° over 3 million Germans from all age groups and social classes go on holiday in a recreational vehicle

° RV manufacturers' turnover in 2018 was a record 11 thousand million euros.

German campers still find that it is good value to spend the night in their own country (according to ADAC). Despite a price increase of about 1€ compared with the previous year, on average it only costs a family in Germany €30.31 per night in 2019. Germany is therefore a country that still offers good value to European campers.

The most expensive camping destination in Europe this year is Italy where it costs €48.35 per night. There, the price increase of over 4% means that this Mediterranean country has now overtaken

Switzerland which was always the most expensive camping destination in recent years.

A nationwide comparison in Germany reveals that **Bavaria** is the N° 1 camping area with nearly 6.2 million nights (up 9.9%). Mecklenburg-Vorpommern with 5 million overnight stays, Lower Saxony with 4.9 million and Baden-Württemberg with 4.6 million have also made their mark.

German campers accounted for around 86.1% of all overnight stays on campsites in 2018 (+ 11.2%). Of the 4.7 million overnight stays by foreign campers (+12.9%), one half came from the Netherlands, followed by Switzerland (14.9%), Denmark (5.9%) and Belgium 5.4%.

MISCELLANEOUS

Great Britain:

Anyone wanting to drive their own car in London has had to dig deeper into their wallet since 8 April 2019 if their vehicle does not comply with the latest emission standards. Following the introduction of the so-called "congestion charge", a T-tax has now been introduced for older, more polluting vehicles, in order to improve air quality.

Since April, driving in an Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) costs £12.50 per day (24hours) instead of £10. For the moment both zones cover the same area i.e. just the inner city, but from October 2021 the ULEZ zone will be extended.

Austria/Slovenia

Better connections in the south east

The new, two kilometre-long ring road round Scharnitz on the German-Austrian border between Munich and the Tirol has eased traffic jams in the area and spares motorists hours of waiting around in long queues.

The showpiece of this engineering project is the one kilometre-long Porta Claudia tunnel. The ring road is especially appreciated by holidaymakers who want to take the German A95 south west via the Karwendel mountains or via the Zirler Berg to Innsbruck.

On the A4 in **Slovenia** the last six kilometres between Podlehnik and the Macelj border crossing have been completed. It means that there is a motorway all the way from Graz in Austria to Zagreb. D-day Festival

2019 is exactly 75 years since the largest seaborne invasion in history took place. It was the beginning of the liberation of western Europe in the Second World War.

Many events are being organised between 25 May to 16 June culminating in D-day celebrations on 6 June. Firework displays will be held on the most important beaches where there were the biggest landings took place. There will be numerous ceremonies and events marking the liberation including an international military parade with several hundred soldiers in Saint-Mère-Eglise and a giant picnic on Omaha Beach.

Environment

Do wolves hunt in water too?

Canadian sea wolves can swim for miles and miles. They can often be seen on small Pacific islands and they hunt herring, salmon and sometimes even small seals. They are descended from the common North American grey wolf that lives on the North American continent but, according to biologists, they have evolved genetically.

Are there trees that can withstand fire?

Yes, the giant sequoias or redwoods in north-west America can grow up to 100m and live for 1,500 years. Their bark is fireproof which is unique in the realm of trees. If there is a forest fire, it is only the uppermost branches that burn, the rest of the tree is protected by the bark, which secretes a liquid that congeals to form a second very tough skin on the trunk.

4 kgs of microplastics per person find their way into the environment every year in Germany alone, making a total of 33,000 tonnes.

The Netherlands: Environmental zones/low emission zones are to be introduced as follows: 1 January 2020 The Hague (will apply to the greater municipal area)

Leiden: for all polluting mopeds and motorbikes

Maastricht: from 1 January 2020 a low emission zone will be introduced for diesel cars in Euroclass 3 and below.

Nijmegen: A trial low emission zone is currently in operation in the Nijmegen region, not just the town itself.

Low emission zones have existed in Amsterdam, Arnhem, Rotterdam and Utrecht for many years.

Portugal: In Lisbon low emission zones are in operation on working days between 7am and 9pm. Generally speaking one may drive everywhere with a Euroclass 3 vehicle.

Czech Republic: Prague has restrictions for goods vehicles but motorcaravans do not fall into this category. In the event of a smog alert, public transport is free – for tourists too.

Sweden: There are low emission zones in Stockholm and Göteborg as well as a "congestion charge". The ban is in operation between 6.30am (6am in Göteborg) and 6.30pm but not at weekends, on bank holidays or in the month of July. Cameras are used for number plate recognition. The bill is sent on afterwards.

Spain: Spain has low emission/environmental zones with environment stickers in different colours. Madrid is a permanent environmental zone for diesel cars below Euroclass 4 and for petrol cars under Euroclass 3. The are more stringent conditions if the air is very polluted. Barcelona only operates an environmental zone if there is heavy pollution.

Italy: Italy has introduced environmental zones "zone a traffico limitato" (ZTL) in a number of cities. Visitors to the city may not enter these zones. Cameras are used for registration recognition and log any vehicles disregarding the ban. If you are staying in a hotel in one of these zones, you must give the hotel your registration number so that you can use your vehicle freely.

Denmark: Cities like Copenhagen, Aalborg, Aarhus and Odense operate environmental zones for buses and goods vehicles. Motorcaravans and caravans are not included in these regulations.

France: Drivers are already familiar with the Crit'Air vignette.
