As we write, Italy, and northern Italy in particular, along with Spain are suffering from the devastating consequences of COVID-19. We wish all of our members in that part of the world and indeed the world over, a speedy recovery from this scourge and a resumption of normal life as soon as possible.

From the **F.I.C.C.** Secretariat: tips for your camping trip to Italy sometime in the future Italian wines (incl. Chianti, Lacrima Christi) are universally popular and much-loved. The Puglia/Apulia region for example has been cultivating its special vines for 250 years. Red wines have been in vogue for many years now, including: Agliancio, Barbera (Piemonte) Brochetto Brunello, Cabernet Sauvignon, Canaio la Nero, Connean, but excellent grape varieties can also be found in the Frioule, Calabria and Campania regions. Sicily, Tuscany and Venice.

Increasingly vines are cultivated organically, tended and nurtured with loving care. Italian wines most definitely rank among life's great pleasures and go down well with any Italian dish, especially when groups of campers are enjoying a get-together.

Connaisseurs have now found the formula for the perfect **Expresso** coffee: 15 rather than 20 grs ground coffee. Grind the beans coarsely and brew for just 7-14 secs rather than 25 secs. One wonders what the Italians and the "baristas" make of that?

On a future trip to Italy – why not stop off and visit the interesting city of Turin. Three of its many restaurants deserve a mention: Enotavola Casa del Barolo, via Bodoni 7; Cannavacciuolo Bistrot, via Umberto Cosmo 6 and Tre Galline, via G. Bellezia 37.

Tip: Heating is often left on in caravans throughout the year which means that the ventilator is continually sucking in dust and fluff. These tiny specks clog up ventilators and slow them down preventing them from operating properly.

So it's a good idea to dismantle your ventilator every two years and clean it. It's not difficult to do and you will then have a ventilator that is always in good working order.

Practical tips – for campers too

Plastic bag dispenser: Put a number of plastic bags in an empty paper tissue box leaving a corner of the last bag poking out. This works really well.

Opening packets of crisps, nuts etc just using your fingers can often be quite tricky. In the absence of a pair of scissors, use two coins. Place the coins on either side of the top edge of the bag and tear it open with a quick flourish.

Electric kettle: to remove limescale in an environmentally friendly way, cut an unused lemon in quarters and boil it up in a kettle full of water. Leave for 12 hours (i.e. overnight), empty the kettle, rinse it out and wipe with a clean sponge.

MISCELLANEOUS

Traffic

Spain: At the beginning of the year, the Spanish city of Barcelona introduced an environmentally-friendly low emission zone that is in operation from 7am to 8pm.

For the first three months anyone infringing the regulation was given a warning, but from 1 April there will be very heavy fines. The low emission zone covers more than 95 sq.km. making it the biggest in Europe. All cars travelling in the city must display a "DGT emissions" sticker. The Spanish authorities reckon that petrol-fuelled cars manufactured before 2000 and diesel vehicles manufactured before 2006 are harmful to the environment. These vehicles do not qualify for a sticker at all and are not welcome in the city. However owners of such vehicles may apply for an exemption online that entitles them to drive inside the Spanish environment zone on 10 days in any one year.

Fines for non-compliance will be severe ranging from 100€ to 1,800€. Source: NKC (NL)

Fines tightened up in Germany in 2020

From now on, road traffic offences will be subject to higher fines i.e. you will have to pay up if you are caught parking your car on a cycle track or pavement or indeed any unauthorised stop on a dedicated strip for cycles, or if double-parked. In these instances, the fine could amount to 100€. Also if you do not move aside to make way for an emergency vehicle access lane, or if you use such a lane without authorization, you can expect to be fined between 200€ and 320€.

The minimum distance that a heavy goods vehicle must observe when overtaking has now been fixed at 1.50m in built-up areas and 2m out-of-town. This also applies when overtaking pedestrians and small electric vehicles.

Health

Prevention is better than cure: According to a trial carried out by researchers at Reading University, cholesterol levels will fall if you eat two apples a day. Scientists found that after two months, the amount of total and LDL cholesterol was reduced and markers associated with blood vessel health had improved in participants who originally had slightly raised cholesterol levels.

Avocados also impact favourably on cholesterol levels. According to a US study, you just need to eat one avocado a day to reduce your LDL level. The study was carried out over five weeks with 45 overweight participants.

Core themes for discussion included: agreeing the deadline for submitting the draft letter to the F.I.C.C. Council demanding that the EU lifts the weight restriction for B class driving licences; setting up a Statistics heading on ficc.org; producing explanatory videos for beginners on a variety of camping themes. The Motorcaravan Commission, comprising Tomas Mehlmauer (Chairman), Fabien Produit (Member) and Andreas Jörn (Member), will happily answer your questions and listen to your suggestions. The next MoCa meeting will be held sometime in August 2020.
