Message from the Rally Organisers

"Last summer a decision was taken to hold the 90th International F.I.C.C. Rally 2021 on the Santa Tecla Campsite in A Guarda (Pontevedra) from 18 to 27 June.

The Coordinating Team of the Spanish Camping Federation that was put in place to organise the event, set up the website <u>www.rallyficc2021.com</u> to supply all relevant information about the rally.

Campers who want to arrive a few days earlier or extend their stay on the campsite, may do so at a cost of 18€ per day between 10 June and 5 July. Campers should contact the campsite direct to make arrangements for their extension. Given all of the uncertainty at present surrounding the pandemic situation, current advice from the FECC Coordinating Team to F.I.C.C. clubs and federations is that they should only transfer booking fees after the Spanish local authorities have confirmed that the event can go ahead. If however some transfers have been made, then they will be refunded minus bank charges".

Perhaps it is a bit early, but when it comes to culinary matters it is never too early to start familiarising yourself with a country's typical food. **Pierogi** are traditional savoury Polish pasties that are filled with potatoes, cheese and bacon or with meat, mushrooms and cabbage.

There is also a sweet version filled with red fruit and berries.

You find Pierogi all over Poland and there are even dedicated Pierogi restaurants that have pasties with every imaginable filling on their menu.

Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning/Tourism

Portugal: Since 1 January 2021, changes have been made to Portugal's road traffic legislation that also affect a regulation governing parking of, and overnight stops in **motorcaravans.** These may now only stop at designated sites. In other words, from now on, stopping in any parking areas is strictly forbidden unless it is expressly indicated that it is allowed.

This measure has been introduced because Portugal's rich cultural heritage makes it such a popular destination and there has been a huge influx of caravans and motorcaravans into the country in recent times.

In the event of non-compliance the authorities, police (GNR) and local councils, are now handing out hefty fines that can be anywhere between 200€ and 36,000€. So wild camping is very much a thing of the past in Portugal.

Useful tips and tricks for optimum maintenance and operation of your caravan chassis

° To avoid white rust forming and even to help eliminate it, wash all galvanised surfaces with clean water.

° If galvanised parts are affected by white rust, use a zinc cleaning product.

° Clean and grease moving parts in the trailer coupling locking mechanism, whatever the make.

[°] Friction linings of the mechanical stabilizing device should be dirt and dust-free, so clean off grease or paint dust resulting from abrasion on the trailer device.

^o Also make sure that the overrun coupling and shock absorbers as well as the parking brake including the pneumatic spring are undamaged.

[°] Lubricate the overrun coupling device. Clean and oil the jockey wheel so that it moves freely.

° All links of the braking system must be free and lubricated. It is also important that the deflection element is rust-free.

° The brake linkage should not be slack. If it does sag, it is time to have your caravan serviced.

° Brake rods and Bowden cables must be free and not show signs of wear, damage, cracks, splits or corrosion.

° Clean off and lightly grease the connector pin on all four corner steadies on a regular basis. Source: Camping, Cars & Caravans – to be continued

Practical tips – for campers too

Digital glossary

WLAN: Wireless Local Area Network is a network that allows appliances (cellphones, tablets etc.) to connect wirelessly. Also known as Wifi.

LTE: Long Term Evolution is a third generation mobile communications standard. A newer version is known as LTE-Advanced or 4G. It enables cellphones and tablets with integrated SIM cards access to the internet. LTE allows faster downloads and uploads than previous mobile communications standards.

5G: Is the fifth generation mobile communications standard and succeeds 4G and related technologies. It is based on the LTE standard. Increasingly widespread since 2019. The 5G standard allows even faster uploads and downloads than LTE.

SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card: A small card containing an integrated circuit (chip) that stores data used in cell phones, tablets, hotspot etc. Used to identify and authenticate subscribers on all mobile devices.

Router: A network device that routes data from a LAN (local area network) to another network connection and connects directly to a modern by a cable. A router communicates with your home wifi network using built-in antennas. As a result, all of the devices on your home network (cell phones, tablets) can surf the internet.

MIMO antenna: Multiple Input Multiple Output. MIMO communication sends the same data as several signals simultaneously through multiple antennas utilising a single radio channel. Denotes an antenna that uses multiple transmitting and receiving elements resulting in much improved quality of reception. Powerful MIMO antennas get the internet via mobile telephony (LTE, 5G) or a local on board WLAN network.

Annoying creases in shirts (despite careful packing) can be magic-ed away if you button up the top part of the shirt and stuff a cushion inside. Dab the crease(s) with a clean damp cloth and dry with a hairdryer on cold or a very low setting.

MISCELLANEOUS

Traffic

Austria raised its vignette prices on 1 December 2020.

There are 10-day, 2-month and annual vignettes. An annual vignette is valid for 14 months i.e. from 1 December of the previous year until 31 January of the following year.

The 2021 vignette is apple green.

Switzerland - new measures from 1 January 2021:

17 year-olds are entitled to apply for a **learner driver's licence** but they may not take the driving test until they are at least 18 years old.

Motorway service stations can serve and sell alcoholic drinks again for the first time since 1964.

Merging lanes: the "zip principle" is mandatory, i.e. when a motorway lane is closed, drivers in open traffic lanes must allow drivers from a closed lane to merge.

One may now drive at 100km/h on Swiss motorways while towing a caravan that weighs no more than 3.5 tonnes rather than at the former maximum speed of 80km/h.

The Sunday driving ban applicable to veteran cars has been lifted.

Children aged 12 and under are allowed to cycle on footpaths and pavements in the absence of dedicated cycle lanes or cycle tracks.

There is a new symbol for **electric vehicle charging stations**. Parking bays with charging stations will be painted green.

Denmark/Faroe Islands: On 19 December 2020, the Eysturoyartunnillin (tunnel) between the islands of Streymoy and Eysturoy was re-opened thereby linking the towns of Runavik and Strendur. This undersea tunnel is about 10kms long and comes complete with a roundabout, a sculpture, music and an interesting multicoloured light show.

Tourism has gained in popularity thanks to this newstyle tunnel connection between the islands.

<u>Health</u>

Dry heating air irritates one's **respiratory tract**. Regular ventilation (intensive short-term ventilation known as rush-airing is best) will regulate the air humidity in a room. One should also drink a lot because that helps prevent the mucus in the respiratory tract from drying out.

Researchers in Harvard Medical School (USA) and Toronto University (Canada) have demonstrated that antibody reaction following the dreaded **corona virus** infection is maintained for at least 90 days. They believe that patients are protected for at least three months before they are likely to be re-infected. Seven hundred volunteers took part in the study.

Cleaning your hands: the lingering smell of onions, garlic, fish etc on your hands can easily be rectified. Mix 2 tbs bicarbonate of soda in a little water until you have a smooth paste. Rub into your



hands and rinse off. Sodium bicarbonate neutralises the smell and leaves your skin wonderfully soft and smooth. A useful tip in these corona virus times when we are constantly disinfecting our hands.

Curious facts and culture

Brazil: Sao Paulo is home to the "Edificio Copan" where 5,000 tenants share a living area of 116,000 sq.m. This residential block is 140m high, has 32 floors and was built in 1966. 100 employees maintain the upkeep of this, the world's biggest residential building.

Italy: In Naples the dell'Arte subway is worth a ride. It is 18km long (15 stops) and lined with fantastic art which makes it one of the biggest museums or art galleries in the world.

In Rome there are plans afoot to install a movable floor in the Colosseum. The original state of the edifice will be maintained but it can be used for theatre productions and concerts without impacting on its appearance in any way.

Norway: The new Edvard Munch Museum that will house the largest collection of the artist's works is opening in Oslo in the spring this year.

Environment/Science

Squirrels scurry around searching for food in the autumn to see them through the long, cold winter months. Each one collects about 10,000 nuts and acorns and stashes them away in various caches out of sight of other creatures. What doesn't get eaten germinates and becomes part of the forest.

The Nepalese and Chinese have remeasured **Mount Everest**, the Roof of the World, and found that it is precisely 8,848.86m. i.e. 86 centimetres higher than was previously thought.

From 3 July 2021, disposable plastic packaging will be banned throughout the EU.

On 4 December 2021, a rare event will take place in the Antarctic region (Weddell Sea area): a total solar eclipse. It will be visible everywhere in that part of the world.

Shield your cellphone from the cold: Low temperatures impair the performance of smart phones because the battery's life reduces quickly when the temperature falls below 10°C. If it gets even colder the screen sometimes disappears. It is best to use a headset to phone and to keep your cellphone next to your body or else use a protective cover made of neoprene.
