91st INTERNATIONAL F.I.C.C. RALLY in MOSCOW/RUSSIA will be held from 29 July to 07 August 2022






There are hotels in the vicinity (Apelsin, Spectroom, Blues) for participants who are unable to come with their own caravan, motorcaravan or tent.

In addition to attending the "Let's Travel Russian Tourism Forum", there will be presentations of campsites, new routes across Russia, workshops, tastings, interactive programmes and entertainment, museum visits and guided architectural tours.

Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

Innovation in caravanning: anti-skid/snaking system

Caravans are not very innovative in terms of technology. However, there is one accessory that is given far too little attention these days that can make a real difference: the electronic anti-snaking system.

The stabilising coupling is standard now, but so far there is no integrated electronic system that switches on when the caravan starts to snake/swing. But such a system can be retrofitted on a car and/or caravan.

On a car

New cars are fitted with an electronic stability programme (ESP). Sensors in the car detect that the car is about to skid and the electronics react quickly by braking one or more wheels so that the car becomes stable once more. The Trailer Stability Programme (TSP or sometimes known by another term) complements this system. When the Programme detects that the towed caravan is snaking or swaying, each wheel will be braked in turn and this action will stabilise the caravan. If this is not enough, the entire outfit will automatically brake and the snaking/swaying will stop.

On a caravan

About 30 years ago, Wolfgang Lubs invented LEAS (Lubs Elektronische Anhänger Stabilisierung – Lubs Electronic Trailer Stabiliser) that applies the trailer brake if the caravan starts to snake or swing. The universal LEAS system, that is still on the market and works well, has been copied by other manufacturers.

The LEAS system has been copied by big manufacturers such as ALKO (with ATC), BPW (with iDC) and Knott (ETS plus). Triorep's "Mountain Brake System" (ITBS) also has an anti-hopping function whereby a sensor in the caravan detects if a caravan is snaking or swinging and activates the trailer brake. The outfit's speed is reduced and the snaking stops.

In practice

The heavier the caravan, the more likely it is to snake. A stabilising coupling ensures that the caravan does not snake so quickly but when it does it will do so rather more violently. Obviously the driver can engage the brake personally, but all electrical systems react far more quickly and more effectively than the best caravan driver in the world possibly can.

Caravan systems react more quickly than the TSP in a car, too quickly sometimes if, for example a caravan bounces about when it is being driven at reduced speed on a bumpy road. It takes just a few seconds to detect how a caravan-car combination is behaving. The same happens when one drives (too?) fast to overtake a truck and the caravan begins to sway in the side wind. The caravan responds quickly and stabilises once the speed drops a little.

If you are driving a heavy towing vehicle using cruise control, you should be especially vigilant. You should have an indicator or display in the car that shows when the system is operating. When the vehicle's TSP kicks in, the caravan really starts to swing. You can feel and hear the vehicle's ABS system vibrating. The lights on the dashboard start flashing and well before you yourself would have braked, the vehicle has already reacted and a potentially dangerous situation is thus avoided. Both systems can work perfectly in tandem which makes for greater safety when towing a caravan.



Remember: electronic systems brake far more quickly than the best driver can!


For a system to be reliable, it is however important that it is properly installed. The TSP function needs to be activated frequently if the trailer coupling/tow hitch is retrofitted.

Unfortunately it often happens that the vehicle's on-board computer is not suitable if a (cheaper) trailer coupling/tow hitch is fitted. So be aware of this when you mount a trailer coupling/tow hitch.

And it is vital to have a good and reliable power supply for these systems to operate in caravans. Above all, use your common sense!

When an anti-snaking system is in operation, the cause of any snaking must be identified and addressed. Remember to load the caravan properly and drive more slowly. Finally the anti-snaking system is only a safety net for use in emergencies and should not be switched on under normal conditions.

However installing an ATC, ITBS, TSP or one of the other electrical stabilising systems in your caravan is a wiser investment than the majority of other visible systems and should be mandatory for all caravans that take to the road. Driving safety is definitely improved.

Practical tips - for campers too

The cold spray we use for sports injuries can be used to loosen **rusty screws**. Simply spray stubborn screws, let it sink in and you will find you can easily remove the screw in the usual way.



Removing eggshells can often be tricky. A simple solution: add a little vinegar to the boiling water. As an eggshell is 90% lime, it will be dissolved by the vinegar and make it easier to peel the egg. (Read somewhere)

MISCELLANEOUS

Traffic

Does the colour of a vehicle help prevent accidents? Apparently it does – because lightcoloured vehicles, especially white ones, reflect the light better and are therefore more visible sooner. According to statistics, black cars are the most accident prone. In hot countries white vehicles absorb up to 8% less heat than darker ones.

Switzerland: In Switzerland all children up to the age of 12 must sit on a child's seat when travelling in a car. If they are taller than 150 cm or older than 12, they must use a seatbelt. Any child's seat is permitted provided that it is appropriate for the child's weight and height and carries one of the two ECE regulatory signs.

The fine for transporting a child who is not properly secured is 60 CHF. Source: Auto – ACS (CH)

The Spanish AP-7 (Tarragona-La Jonquera and Montmélo- El Papiol) and AP-2 (Zaragoza-El Vendrell) motorways will become free from 1 September 2021. The sections of the C-32 (Barcelona-Lloret de Mar) and the C-33 (Barcelona-Montmelo) are also free for the time being, as the concessions have ended. However, it can be assumed that a vignette will be introduced at some point.

Cigarette manufacturers should be required to contribute an annual amount of 80 million euros towards removing this garbage and invest in pocket ashtrays, cigarette trash cans and a new recycling system.
