Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

Preparations for overwintering your caravan or motorcaravan

Proper preparation is essential if you do not intend using your caravan or motorcaravan during the winter months.

- a) Your vehicle's bodywork and underside will need a thorough cleaning after your adventures on the road this summer. Water and a mild car shampoo are ideal - use a soft sponge and a brush, preferably one with a telescopic handle for the upper part of the bodywork.
- b) Once your caravan has dried off, it is worth applying a sealant and there are special waxes on the market that you can apply and finish off with a cloth. Talcum powder is one of the suitable products that is good for rubber seals.



- c) The entire drinking water installation, tank and fittings should be drained before the winter. This means waste pipes, syphons and the waste water tank. It is important not to replace the stoppers on the drinking water and waste water tanks after cleaning. This will allow residual damp to evaporate thereby preventing the proliferation of micro-organisms.
- d) The on-board battery is the main and indispensable source of energy for many caravans and motorcaravans while away on holiday. During the winter months the battery should not be allowed to discharge fully and should therefore be recharged at regular intervals. In modern vehicles however, depending on the location, the battery charger can remain connected all the time. In principle, batteries should be kept at an even temperature so that they discharge more slowly.
- e) Gas bottles must be firmly closed off at the end of the season, separated from the supply line and fitted with a protective cap. Covering outdoor sockets and outlets will discourage vermin from venturing inside. Be wary of ventilating your van on a regular basis but rather leave all cupboard doors open and stand cushions up. To be on the safe side install a dehumidifier. Coffee powder will help prevent musty smells.
- f) Increasing the air pressure slightly will protect your tyres – approx. 0.5 bar above the normal recommended tyre pressure for a caravan. Additionally, concave wheel chocks take the strain off the tyre structure. For caravans, lowering the supports. is also a good way of spreading the weight.
- g) Once the caravan is properly installed you can release the handbrake otherwise the brake blocks might stick to the drum or you could find that the brake cables do not respond at the end of the winter period. It is also essential to test the overrun brake in your caravan before setting off for the first time next year.
- h) Your caravan needs to be properly “garaged” over the winter, ideally somewhere dry, in a car port, a barn or a hangar.

Portugal: In recent times “wild camping” has been tolerated for 48 hours in a good many places but not in special conservation areas such as Natura 2000 or on the coast.

Officially wild camping was banned in Portugal a long time ago although it was often tolerated in many areas. In the end wild camping got completely out of control to the extent that in the summer of 2020, 600 caravans were found to be parked in areas where they were not allowed to stay overnight.

The new regulations are better for campers. Caravanners may stay for 48 hours in any municipality provided that there is no local law forbidding this practice. How local authorities decide on the permissible length of stay and enforce these new regulations is not yet clear. However, camping overnight is absolutely forbidden in nature reserves or conservation areas such as Natura 2000 or on the coast unless one is at a proper campsite.

In summary

Since 25 August 2021:

Parking during the day and at night (with people in the vehicle) for a maximum of 48 hours in the same municipality is allowed, with the exception of:

- ° Areas designated as Rede Natura 2000 (which is one third of Portugal).
- ° areas designated as POOC (Plano de Ordenamento da Orla Costeira) - a large part of the coastline



° Municipalities where the mayor has issued a ban on parking of mobile homes.

The government will set up a system for locating mobile homes (through geo-referencing), where mobile home owners will have to register in advance to be located and know if they are staying in the same municipality for more than 48 hours.

Snow chains: Put them on properly and adapt your driving

It often happens that you need chains for the final leg of your journey on snow-covered side roads or steep access roads. So put your chains on in advance and don't wait until your vehicle gets stuck. After driving for a few metres, stop and tighten the chains again.

Warning: Driving with chains changes the steering behaviour of your vehicle. When you brake in a front-wheel drive car, the rear will slide and swerve because the rear wheels have no lateral guidance. Rear-wheel drive cars will tend to "wobble" rather than drive in a straight line because the steering does not operate as efficiently.

Tip: An old pair of gloves and an old bit of carpeting are very useful when it comes to putting chains on.

MISCELLANEOUS

Traffic

E-cars: People in the know are not unreservedly enthusiastic about e-cars because they say they contribute to depleting mineral reserves. Compared with a car that runs on petrol, an e-car needs 53 kgs of copper (instead of 22 kgs), 25 kgs of manganese (11 kgs) and up to 66 kgs more lithium, cobalt and nickel.

Germany: From 2023, Germany will no longer be supporting or promoting palmoil-based biofuels. People want to see an end to the practice of clearing forests, draining moors and marshland and generally destroying nature in the interests of biofuels. The government will progressively introduce fuel made from garbage and residual materials.

Austria: On 13 December, Austrian railways are introducing an overnight train from Paris to Vienna via Munich. Comfortable sleeper compartments with shower facilities and breakfast service provide a climate-friendly alternative to flying or driving.

Health

Tai chi is good for one's flexibility. In China it is a popular sport that is often practised in public squares and parks. This form of exercise with its fluid movements corrects faulty posture and improves flexibility, especially in older people.

Important: early treatment of a sprain or bruising

Rest: the foot needs to be rested for a few days after which you can gradually put weight on it.

Ice: ice packs (not directly on the skin but wrapped in a towel) or a cold compress will ease the pain.

Compression: an elastic compression bandage will reduce the swelling.

Elevate the leg to reduce the blood flow to the injured foot.

“Silent night! Holy night!” is the best loved, most famous and most often sung Christmas carol in the world and is listed by UNESCO as part of Austria’s Intangible Cultural Heritage. It has been translated into 320 languages and dialects and performed by countless famous singers.

The words started out as a poem written by a priest, Joseph Mohr, in 1815 and the music was composed by Franz Xaver Gruber an organist and teacher, in 1818. The carol was sung for the first time on 24 December 1818 in the the small parish church of Oberndorf

In a roundabout way, the new song reached the master organ builder Karl Maurischer in Fügen (Zillertal) and the Tyrolean singing society farmers who toured all of Europe in winter as travelling merchants.

They spread the song far and wide with missionaries playing a part too, and it eventually turned up on the continent of America.

One Christmas, something miraculous happened on the western front in World War I: thousands of soldiers of all nationalities came together, laid down their arms, took off their helmets and sang carols from their homelands including “Silent night!” A short and unique interval of peace because ever after, such fraternization was forbidden under pain of death.

UNESCO added this carol to its Intangible Cultural Heritage list in 2011.
