

Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

What are the regulations governing "wild camping" in France? Where is camping allowed and where is it forbidden? What is the difference between bivouacing and wild camping? The difference between these two concepts lies in the length of stay and in the equipment used. Bivouacing is what climbers and hikers tend to do most on their travels because they spend their nights en route in unknown territory far from any formal camping infrastructure. Wild camping on the other hand attracts people travelling around by car who want to stop for a few days but also want to be within reach of the amenities of modern living.

But you may not stop and camp just anywhere in France and wild camping is only tolerated to a limited extent. Decree N° 2015-1783 of 28 December 2015 lists restrictions as follows:

- No stopping over in woods, groves and parks that are classified as protected wooded areas
- On protected listed sites
- On classified sites and those listed as protected natural heritage and conservation areas



- Less than 500m from a classified or registered historical monument
- On the seashore/along sea coasts
- Within a radius of 200m from a water source that is used for drinking purposes
- In any defined area covered by a municipal decree for health or safety reasons.

As regards camping on so-called "private" land, this is possible provided the owner has given permission. However, not all landowners are enthusiastic about campers settling on their property and fines for unauthorised camping can be as much as €1,500. After a night of "wild camping" you should always ensure that you leave the area as clean as it was when you arrived, that you take your rubbish away with you, you do not empty toilets or grey water and you put any rocks, branches etc that you may have moved, back in their original place.

Tents are making a comeback

In camping terms, tents have been relegated to third place for a long time and camping in a tent had all but disappeared. Caravans, camper vans and mobile homes dominated the scene. But things have changed and now the tent is definitely back in fashion. Whether it's a dome tent, a tunnel tent or a frame tent, fabric walls have become popular once more which was obvious just about everywhere this summer.

Glamping: You are hearing a lot more about glamping these days and many campsites are offering this type of "camping". This is tent camping taken to a luxurious level: you don't sleep on an airbed on the ground but in a proper bed with soft pillows in surroundings that are so comfortable that they are worthy of a 4* hotel. What is handy is that everything is supplied so you don't need to bring anything with you. It certainly feels more like camping and being close to nature than being in a hotel.

The word glamping comes from two English words "glamorous" and "camping". It is a new word that has existed officially since 2005 and first appeared in the Oxford dictionary in 2016. S.B.

Practical tips – for campers too

Fill up a spray top bottle with vodka and use to keep wasps away and even render them harmless.

Screwtops that are stuck can be rescued: If the thread no longer bites in the screwtop, wind an elastic band round it which gives a better grip.

Alternatively use a good old-fashioned nutcracker.

Chalk keeps ants at bay: A simple line drawn in chalk outside your front door or balcony door or even on a window sill should be enough to deter an invasion of ants.

Chalk has an alkaline pH value of 8.5 that deregulates ants' acid-alkaline balance – and so they stop at the line of chalk!



MISCELLANEOUS

Traffic

Cars: A combustion engine vehicle should not be parked on a bay reserved for e-vehicles, especially not if it is a charging bay. It could be towed away because it is depriving an electric vehicle driver of the legal right to use a charging station (a recent court decision in Germany).

Health

Rubbing one's chest and back with a face cloth soaked in **vodka** is a good way of bringing down a high temperature.

First aid in the event of an electric shock (a frequent occurrence in the home too). Do not put yourself in danger by moving or touching the victim! First turn off the electricity (pull out the mains plug or fuse).

Once the pulse and breathing are back to normal, place victim in the recovery position. Call the emergency services immediately on 112 and start heart massage. Keep the person warm by covering with a blanket. Disinfect any small superficial burns on the skin and treat with iodine ointment if available.

Warning: For accidents involving high voltage, call the emergency services immediately on 112 and leave the recovery and care procedures to trained professionals.

Curious facts/environment/culture

The **wax moth is** the creature that has the most acute hearing. It can detect sound up to a frequency of 300kHz whereas the human ear can only hear up to 20kHz. Moths communicate using the same high-pitched sound that bats (their natural enemy) use.

The biggest palace in the world is still the "Forbidden City" in Beijing. It is protected by a 50m wide moat and the complex within the walls covers a surface area of 720,000 sq.m. The palace of Versailles/France has a total surface area within the walls of 8,150.00 sq.m. The biggest inhabited castle is Windsor Castle (Great Britain) – 45,000 sq.m.

There really is a **Saint James Waterway** and one can take a pilgrim route to Santiago de Compostella by sea. Point of departure is Portosin harbour (Spain) and then follow the old sea routes that were used in the Middle Ages to your destination. Your pilgrim passport will be stamped in the ports.

The "**Sphere**" in Las Vegas/Nevada-USA will open with the first in a series of 25 concerts on 29 September. This massive dome, or round pyramid as it is also called, can seat 18,600 spectators. A gigantic projection area comprises 1.2 million LED over 54,000 sq.m. Another "Sphere" is planned in London.


