97th INTERNATIONAL F.I.C.C. RALLY 2026 IN CHINA

Dates: 25 September to 4 October 2026 in Renhuai, in north-west Guizhou Province



Renhuai City is a county-level city under the jurisdiction of Guizhou Province and serves as a regional centre city in the Chishui River Basin. It is located in the northwest of Guizhou Province on the middle reaches of the Chishui River and is the connecting point between the Qianbei Economic Zone (North Guizhou) and the Chuannan Economic Zone (South Sichuan). Covering a total area of 1,788 square

kilometres, it administers 20 municipalities (including sub-districts) and has a total population of 740,000 people from nine ethnic groups, including Han, Miao and Bouyei.

The city was founded in 1109 AD during the Northern Song Dynasty as Renhuai County. The name embodies the principles of 'showing benevolence to all people and governing the border communities with reconciliation'. The region has a central subtropical humid monsoon climate. The south-eastern areas are dominated by high mountains and hills, while the north-west has river valleys and sloping terrain that form an arched three-tiered topography. The landscape is characterised by hilly mountains, towering peaks, intersecting gorges, steep slopes and deep valleys, which have different landforms.

Renhuai is the home of Baijiu (colourless liquor between 35% and 60%), the hometown of Maotai liquor and the main production area for China's Jiangxiang-style distilled spirits. The city is also historically significant as the site of the 'Four Crossings of the Chishui River' by the Red Army during the Long March. The city has been awarded titles such as Sixth National Civilisation City, National Hygiene City and National Ecological Civilisation Demonstration City. Due to its unique ecology, climate, soil and microbial environment, Renhuai is a major production area for high-quality baijiu in the Jiangxiang Stile. In 2004, Renhuai was officially named 'China's Liqueur Capital'.

Austria: Camping is still booming

The travel and booking portal camping.info has analysed overnight stays on Austrian campsites in 2024 on the basis of official Austrian statistics. With over 8.5 million overnight stays (+2% on the previous year), the camping sector broke its own record for the fourth year running. As always, Carinthia, with over 2.5 million overnight stays, is the most popular Austrian state for camping, followed by the Tirol and Salzburg.

German campsites too have registered 1.4% more overnight stays in 2024 compared with 2023. With 42.9 million overnight stays, numbers have doubled in the past 20 years.

Most campers' preferred destination in 2024 was the Schleswig-Holstein Baltic coast, recording 3.4 million overnight stays.

Camping with a dog

This requires careful planning.

Here are a few points that dog owners should take on board:

The caravan or motorcaravan should have a place where the animal can sleep that is suitable and at a pleasant temperature. Non-slip dog beds are available.

While travelling, the dog must be "restrained" (car seat belts that can be attached to a harness) or else remain safe inside in a pet carrier.

Stop often enough for your dog to have a drink, move around and do its business.

Once at the camp site, you must abide by the pet regulations in place. It is best to inquire beforehand because some campsites ban pets altogether while others offer dog play areas etc.

They must be kept on a lead at all times.

Always dispose of the animal's droppings in a special dog waste bag.

Campers' leisure activities should be fun for the dog as well.

The dog must be microchipped or carry some other form of ID.

Before going away, go to a vet to make sure your dog is healthy and its vaccinations up-to-date.

Don't forget any medication and remember to pack enough dog food so that your pet can eat what he is used to and isn't expected to change his diet.

EU Driving Licence Reform

Several months ago, the EU agreed on reform of the driving licence directive that will probably come into force from 2029. In future, under certain conditions, the weight limit for Class B would be raised to 4.25 tonnes.

This new directive has however not yet been published in its final form as there are still a few points to be explained such as the definition of alternative drive systems i.e. fuel and regulations on trailers for motorcaravans. Here there is need for further clarification, especially the wording "up to 4.25 t + trailer" as to whether this means a light trailer (up to 750kg MAM – maximum authorized mass) or a heavy trailer.

EU member states have up to 2029 to implement the directive and translate it into national law.

We await the final wording of the directive and its publication.

New legislation in Greece: Law 5170/2025 considerably restricts wild camping in Greece. It prohibits permanent parking of caravans, camper vans and converted buses outside officially designated places. Pitching a tent is forbidden in some areas. The aim of this legislation is to regulate the use of public spaces and avoid damage to the environment. Fines of 300€ per person will be levied for breaching the law. Private landowners only may accommodate just one motorcaravan on their land. The Greek Ministry for Tourism stressed that the law is intended as a health and safety measure and to prevent the misuse of public spaces.

Practical tips - for campers too

Water from boiling **potatoes** is excellent for fertilising house plants.

But it should be unsalted and cooled down first!

Fresh herbs keep for 2-3 days wrapped in a damp cotton towel.

The French butter dish that keeps butter fresh and spreadable without a refrigerator.

It consists of two cups that you can buy commercially. You pack the ceramic cup with butter and put it upside down in the larger cup that contains water. The water provides an airtight seal for the butter. Change the water every 2 or 3 days and the butter will stay fresh for about a month.
